## Festive Frolicks 2008

The 2008 Festive Handicap and Cockleroy Chaser enjoyed a record combined entry, with around 180 finishers, made up of runners from all over the country. First runner back in the 'Cockleroy Chaser' was 9 year old Ross McKinnell in a time of 4:42, closely followed by Alice Horsburgh (11) in 4:45, with Ian Horsburgh (9) third in 4:52. Youngest finisher was two and a half year old Ethan West. The judges on the finish line were very impressed by the smiles as runners completed the course and a generous sprinkling of juice, Kit-Kats and Penguins was handed out.

The first three finishers in the Handicap event were David Murdoch (Edinburgh Uni. Tri Club) at 12:08:25, Annie Ewing (EU Tri Club), 12:08:26 and Jonathon Whitehead (Edin. AC) at 12:09:25. Fastest men's times over the 14km course were Mark Johnston (Bellahouston), 49:57, with joint second Iain Donnan and Scott Fraser in 50:55, both of whom were doing 'a training run.' Fastest women were Kim Threadgill (Edin. AC), in 58:31, Annie Ewing in 62:26, and Suzanne Matonti in 63:58. Fastest over the 7km course were Mark Ardnt (Arbroath AC), 25:45, Robert Inglis 25:54 and Alastair Robertson 26:23 and in the women's event Sarah Inglis 26:46, Moira Davie (unatt.) 31:05 and Rachel McIlwraith, 32:01. Nearly 40 Club members ran in the 7km/14km event, which is also a record, and with strong representation from youngsters in the Chaser event, there was plenty of evidence that there is still a sizeable pool of enthusiasm around. With so many running, it meant that volunteers to marshal were a bit thin on the ground however, and there's one or two things that I'll have to think about ahead of the 2009 event.
